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KBOR Votes on Changes to Excel in CTE Initiative Guidelines

During the November 19, 2025 Kansas Board of Regents meeting, a vote approved new guidelines for the Excel in CTE program that will limit what technical programs are eligible for state-funded tuition beginning Fall 2026. While these new changes could impact enrollment, KBOR states they believe this will help combat the rising costs observed in the state-funded initiative over the past several years. The Excel in Career Technical Education Initiative was enacted in 2012 and provides high school students with state-funded college tuition to enter into high-wage, high-demand careers. In previous years, industry-recognized credentials that were approved by the state were eligible for state-funded tuition, usually consisting of high-demand occupations as determined by the Kansas Department of Labor.

Effective Fall 2026, all state funding for Excel in CTE will follow the lead of the Kansas Promise Act pathways, meaning some current programs will no longer qualify for the state-funded tuition. Similar to Excel in CTE, the Kansas Promise Act offers scholarships to full-time or part-time students, instead of dual credit students, that are enrolled in specific high-demand and critical-need industry programs. Technical programs like cosmetology and culinary arts, while currently approved for the Excel in CTE program, are not approved Kansas Promise Act pathways.

These changes won't prohibit dual credit students from enrolling in these programs, but it does mean they will do so without the help of state-funded tuition assistance. A list of approved programs by institution can be found at the link below.

2025 Laura Cross Distinguished Service Award

For those that have any tie to Southwestern College, they know the story of the Jinx and the rivalry between Southwestern College and Fairmount College (now Wichita State). When I returned to Southwestern, there were students at Southwestern that didn't believe the story of students from Fairmount College stealing the Jinx and blowing it up to break the jinx that Southwestern had over Fairmount College in football. Laura was a student at Fairmount College when this was happening, and she graciously agreed to come to Winfield to speak at the Matriculation Convocation and give a first-hand account of the story. The students, faculty and staff were in awe of Laura and her ability to recall all of the events like it was yesterday.

There are not many left in KACRAO that had the pleasure of meeting and knowing Laura Cross. I consider myself one of the lucky ones to have the first-hand experience of spending quality time with her. My favorite Laura Cross story was when people would ask her about her 70 years of service to Wichita State and if she had tenure.

Her response was always, "I don't need to have tenure, I have blackmail and that is much better!"

Laura Cross was called the "Grande Dame" of Fairmount Hill, but to me she was the ultimate professional and one of the first admissions professionals in the state of Kansas that I got to call a friend and colleague. To receive the award named for her is the ultimate recognition that I could ever receive and means more to me than words can express. I look at the award often and think of how blessed I have been in my career to know some of the great people of KACRAO. That includes Dick Elkins, Ev Kohls, Beth Tedrow, and Laura Cross. Nothing can compare to receiving the Laura M Cross Distinguished Service Award.

Again, I'm honored, humbled, and appreciative of this recognition, and thank those responsible for me receiving the award.

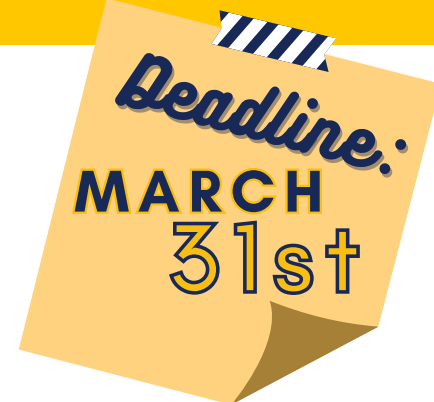
